Parish Council

The Parish Council is always encouraged by the attendance of Parishioners at its Parish meetings, as it is vital that parishioners hear the comments that Councillors make during the course of the meetings. Comments made by Parishioners during the Public part of the meeting are always appreciated.

As a result of recent comment received by the Parish Council I thought it might be helpful if I outlined the role of the Council and Councillors. The Council represents and serves the whole community and is responsible for the service it provides. It establishes policies for action and decides how money will be raised and spent on behalf of the Community and is responsible for spending public money lawfully and achieving best value for money. It is the role of Councillors to work together to serve the community and to help the Council to make decisions on behalf of the local community.

As a result of a Councillor resigning 10 members of the Parish asked for an election to take place. This was advertised but no nominations came forward, thus the process had to be repeated and will do so until a Councillor is elected. The cost to the Parish will be in excess of £3,000. It is hoped by the time that you read this newsletter we will no longer be minus a Councillor.

The Clerk is employed to provide administrative support for Council activities, giving advice on whether its decisions are lawful and to recommend ways in which decisions can be implemented. There are other responsibilities included within the Clerk's role.

The Welcome Home and Memorial Playing Field

The Playing Field Committee have had another busy and successful year. Further refurbishment of the pavilion and new chairs has contributed to making the club room an attractive venue to hire.



As a result of much interest shown in upgrading the young children's Play Area the committee are pursuing grant applications and local funding for the Play Area Equipment project to make the area a more stimulating and interesting environment for children to 'learn through play'. The committee are extremely grateful for the generous local support that they have received and to the local Mums who have enthusiastically held fund raising events, such as coffee mornings and Ladies evenings. Planning

The Council has been very busy in this past year looking at a variety of planning applications, which have included Mill Close, the Heath Farm development between Caistor Lane and Stoke Road, All Saints Centre in The Footpath and the Shotesham Road development, as well as a large number of smaller residential development plans, for example extensions.

The Council is very mindful of the concerns of parishioners in connection with increased development and associated highway activity, whether vehicular or pedestrian. Your Council takes your concerns very seriously and does everything within its powers to assist the Community to help ensure public safety within the Community, which has included discussion with the Highway Authority. A review of traffic issues is being considered in an effort to address your concerns across the whole Parish area. It is very difficult at times to be able to satisfy the concerns of everyone, as the Council has to work with the powers that it has.

The Six Strategic Group

The Youth Council for the six villages, known as the 6YC is now up and running and looking at issues whereby it can assist in the development of activities within the six villages, one of which is the development of a Skate Park in Poringland.
